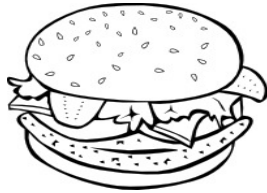

Please update and/or correct this information. **Then please sign and date it and return it to school in the envelope.** Please feel free to attach a note with any other information that you feel the school should have regarding your child's health and safety.
- A blue Elementary School Supplies Form with a neighbourhood walk tick box. We have already purchased all the supplies for our students so we count on your cooperation in buying them from the school. The cultural amount of \$15.00 is to cover the cost of having professional groups come to the school to do presentations. Each student is getting a copy of this form. If you send one cheque for a family, please indicate on each form which student's envelope has the cheque!
- A consent form for technology and a media permission form. This is a double sided white form which will be placed in student files.
- A Volunteer Driver form which you will need to complete if you are going to help out by driving on field trips.
- A white Threat Assessment letter from Superintendent Terry Sullivan.
- Information about school photo day, which will be on Friday, September 21, 2012
- Information about the BC Fruit and Vegetable Program if your student is new to our school.

Working It Out

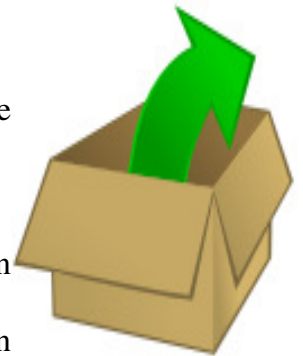
Preparing children for today's world involves teaching them a broad range of skills. In addition to academic skills, they must also learn the skills for working well with others and settling their differences peacefully. To help them acquire these skills we will be using a program called “Working It Out”, a conflict management program in which children learn to:

- Communicate and work well with others.
- Express feelings in constructive ways.
- Treat others fairly.
- Resolve disagreements peacefully.

Our September theme looks at ways people can have different ideas and opinions about the same thing. These experiences prepare them for listening to one another's point of view during a conflict. By understanding differing views of the problem, children are better able to find a solution that is fair to both sides.

Here are some suggestions of home-based activities which will reinforce what students will be learning about at school:

- Point out different ways family members may see a situation or talk about people's differing opinions about things such as food, clothing, or ways to solve a puzzle or a problem. Your child is learning that when people listen and share ideas – even if they disagree – there is much they can learn from one another.
- To help your child consider the other person's point of view during a disagreement, ask questions such as, “How would you explain your sister's side of the story?”
